As a result, Respondent’s peace officer certification in the State of Colorado must be summarily suspended.

8. POST hereby summarily suspends Respondent’s peace officer certification in the State of Colorado pursuant to §§ 24-4-104(4) and 24-4-105(12), C.R.S.

9. Respondent cannot engage in duties and employment that require a certification to practice as a peace officer in the State of Colorado or hold himself out as able to act as a certified peace officer in the State of Colorado while his certification is suspended.

10. The pendency of any disciplinary action shall not affect the obligation of Respondent to comply with this Order.

Pursuant to § 24-31-315(2)(a), C.R.S., the POST Board shall suspend a peace officer’s certification if the peace officer fails to comply with annual in-service training requirements in subsection 1 of this section. The POST Board shall reinstate a peace officer’s certification that was suspended upon completion of the training requirements.

4. Annual in-service training requirements for certified peace officers for the 2021-2022 training cycle were due between June 30, 2022 and August 8, 2022.

5. Respondent was provided a 30-day compliance notice on August 2, 2022, expiring between September 2, 2022.

6. Respondent failed to complete the annual in-service training requirements as of September 9, 2022 and remains out of compliance as of the date of this order.

7. On September 9, 2022, the Board convened in a regularly scheduled and publicly noticed meeting. At that meeting, the Board found that, upon full investigation of the documents and information presented, there are objective and reasonable grounds to believe that Respondent does not have the requisite in-service training to act as a certified peace officer in the State of Colorado, and the public health, safety, and welfare imperatively requires emergency action. As a result, Respondent’s peace officer certification in the State of Colorado must be summarily suspended.

8. POST hereby summarily suspends Respondent’s peace officer certification in the State of Colorado pursuant to §§ 24-4-104(4) and 24-4-105(12), C.R.S.

9. Respondent cannot engage in duties and employment that require a certification to practice as a peace officer in the State of Colorado or hold himself out as able to act as a certified peace officer in the State of Colorado while his certification is suspended.

10. The pendency of any disciplinary action shall not affect the obligation of Respondent to comply with this Order.

11. This Order does not resolve any other cases, complaints, or matters, known or unknown to the POST or Respondent, as of the effective date of this Order.

12. This Order shall be a public record in the custody of the POST.

THEREFORE, pursuant to the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the peace officer certification of Raymond Walsh is suspended.

**ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION**

The Peace Officer Standards and Training Board (“POST”), having reviewed all available information as to the matters referenced below, HEREBY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

3.
