- 9. Respondent cannot engage in duties and employment that require a certification to practice as a peace officer in the State of Colorado or hold himself out as able to act as a certified peace officer in the State of Colorado while his certification is suspended.
- 10. The pendency of any disciplinary action shall not affect the obligation of Respondent to comply with this Order.
- 11. This Order does not resolve any other cases, complaints, or matters, known or unknown to the POST or Respondent, as of the effective date of this Order.
  - 12. This Order shall be a public record in the custody of the POST.

THEREFORE, pursuant to the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the peace officer certification of Andrew Weaver is suspended.
