11. Subject Matter Expert Reports

a. Curriculum

Janet Larson Chair

The Curriculum SME committee met yesterday. They are currently down to 19 members following the departure of Officer Timothy Railsback. The committee is almost completed with the Red Rocks lesson plans review. They have eight lesson plans left to approve. Red Rocks is planning on opening in August, so the committee has a deadline for these approvals by July. The committee is working towards brining 10 revisions to the board by the December POST board meeting.

b. Arrest Control

The ACT SME committee has been searching for subject matter experts to join the committee and complete inspections and test outs. Applications have been sent out to Pueblo, Montrose, Alamosa, and State Patrol so, they are hoping to have these prospective members join soon. The committee also had a few injury reviews where no abnormalities were found. They also received three full skills applications from Douglas County, Larimer County, and Evans Police Department. A discussion was conducted pertaining to an article that was released on ACT being a teaching point of academies' custodial care section. The committee is planning on making this an agenda item. A program submission from the Technical College of the Rockies was received and the committee is working on bringing it to the board for approval during the next meeting. Lastly the committee had a discission with the Fort Collins PD about their program and they will be working with the director and the compliance team to get the program up and running.

POST Rule 9 - Revocation of Peace Officer Certifications: Pursuant to § 24-31-305(2)(a), C.R.S., a Colorado peace officer certification issued pursuant to subsection (1) or (1.3) of this section or 24-31-308 shall be suspended or revoked by the POST Board if the certificate holder has been convicted of a felony at any time, or has been convicted on or after July 1, 2001, of any misdemeanor described in subsection (1.5) of § 24-31-305, C.R.S. A Colorado peace officer certification may also be suspended or revoked if pursuant to § 24-31-305(2.5), C.R.S., a law enforcement agency has found, by clear and convincing evidence, that the certificate holder has knowingly made an untruthful statement concerning a material fact while testifying under oath, or during an internal affairs investigation or comparable administrative investigation; or knowingly omitted a material fact on an official criminal justice record, or has otherwise failed to meet the certification requirements established by the Board. A Colorado peace officer certification may also be surrendered pursuant to § 24-31-305. For purposes of this Rule 9, a deferred judgment and sentencing agreement, deferred prosecution agreement, or pretrial diversion agreement concerning a felony, or any misdemeanor described in (1.5) of § 24-31-305, whether pending or successfully completed, also support the suspension or revocation of a Colorado peace office certification.

Felony Convictions:

 F22-10, Cameron River Braveheart, Certification PID CO-136899. On July 11, 2022, the responded was sentenced after being found guilty at jury trial, for one count of § 18-5-902(1)(b) C.R.S. ID Theft – Possession with intent to Use, a Felony, and one count of § 18-8-404 C.R.S., Official Misconduct 1, a Misdemeanor, in case number 2021CR94 in the Montrose County Court. The respondent was employed as a peace officer at the time of the offense (Dates of Offense: November 30, 2020-December 2, 2020, Montrose County Sheriff's Office, Separation March 18, 2021). The responded has complied with POST Show Cause Order No. F22-10 by appearing on October 6, 2022. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Cameron River Braveheart's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-136899.

Motion to revoke – 1st Dingfelder, 2nd Nowlin Approved unanimously.

Misdemeanor Convictions:

 M22-05, Christopher Mecca, Certification PID CO-135953. On January 31, 2022, Respondent was sentenced after being found guilty following a jury trial to one count of §18-3-204(1)(a) C.R.S. Assault 3-know/reckless Cause Injury, a Misdemeanor, and one count of §18-8-404 C.R.S. First Degree Official Misconduct, a Misdemeanor, in Case No. 2020M1575 in the Boulder County Court. The respondent was employed as a peace officer at the time of the offence (Date of Offense: September 23, 2020, Boulder County Sheriff's Office, Separation October 9, 2020). The respondent has complied with POST Show Cause Order No. M22-05 by appearing on December 14, 2022. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Christopher Mecca's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-135953.

Motion to revoke – 1st Smith, 2nd Beck Approved unanimously.

 M22-13, Wayne Nelson, Certification PID CO-121060. On October 28, 2022, Respondent was granted a deferred sentence for three counts of § 18-3-404(1)(a) C.R.S., Sexual Contact – No Consent, a Misdemeanor, in Case No. 2021CR1403 in the Jefferson District Court. The respondent was not employed as a peace officer at the time of the offense. The respondent has complied with POST Show Cause Order No. M22-13 by appearing on February 22, 2023. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Wayne Nelson's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-121060.

Motion to revoke – 1st Mazzola, 2nd Barnes Approved unanimously.

3. M22-15, John Maedel, Certification PID CO-139836. On November 23, 2022, Respondent was granted a deferred sentence for one count of § 18-9-111(1)(c) C.R.S. Harassment - follow person in public place, a Misdemeanor, in Case No. 2022CR622 in the Weld County District Court. The respondent was employed as a peace officer at the time of the offence (Dates of Offence: July 1, 2021 – April 8, 2022, Weld County Sheriff's Office, Separation April 27, 2022). The respondent has complied with POST Show Cause Order No.M22-15 by appearing on January 25, 2023. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of John Maedel's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-139836.

Bourgerie recommends revocation of Blake David Burtard's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-134038.

On January 25, 2023, Respondent was granted a deferred sentence after pleading guilty to one count of § 18-3-204(1)(a) Assault 3 know/reckless cause injury C.R.S., a Misdemeanor, in Case No. 2022CR98 in the Huerfano County Court. The respondent was employed as a peace officer on the date of the offense (Date of Offense: August 18, 2022, Huerfano County Court, Huerfano County Sheriff's Office, Separated November 30, 2022). The respondent has not complied with POST Show Cause Order No. M23-03 by failing to appear at the scheduled Show Cause Hearing on March 27, 2023. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Jeffrey Scott Schnedler's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-4126-9072.
- 3. No. M23-04, Valeri Nicole Pedraza, Certification PID CO-3337-1642. On January 19, 2023, Respondent was granted a deferred sentence after pleading guilty to one count of § 18-3-204(1)(a) C.R.S., Assault 3 know/reckless cause injury, a Misdemeanor, in Case No. 2022M5082 in the Larimer County Court. The respondent was employed as a peace officer on the date of the offense (Date of Offense: May 29, 2022, Larimer County Court, Fort Collins Police Department, Separated November 9, 2022). The respondent has not complied with POST Show Cause Order No. M23-04 by failing to appear at the scheduled Show Cause Hearing on March 27, 2023. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Valeri Nicole Pedraza's Colorado Peace Officer Certification, PID CO-3337-1642.

- 1. No. U23-03, Shannon D. Everhart, Certification (PID CO-139607). On February 13, 2023, Woodland Park Police Department notified Colorado. Peace Officer Standards & Training that the Respondent knowingly made an untruthful statement concerning a material fact or omitted a material fact on an official criminal justice record and while testifying under oath on several dates in 2022 (Date of Separation: December 2, 2022). The respondent did not request a Show Cause Hearing regarding this matter POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Shannon D. Everhart's Colorado Peace Officer Certification (PID CO-139607).
- No. U23-05, Kimberly E. Lovato, Certification (PID CO-121700). On April 4, 2023, Denver Police Department notified Colorado Peace Officer Standards & Training that the Respondent knowingly made an untruthful statement concerning a material fact or omitted a material fact during an internal affairs investigation on April 18, 2022 (Date of Separation: February 17, 2023). The respondent did not request a Show Cause

Hearing regarding this matter. POST Director Erik J. Bourgerie recommends revocation of Kimberly E. Lovato's Colorado Peace Officer Certification (PID CO-121700).

These revisions will allow non-certified peace officers to be eligible for funding as well as long as they are a Colorado peace officer. There were also a few updates to usage of personal and fleet vehicle usage, as well as clarifying what equipment is allowed to be purchased with grant funding.
